Boutique 7.765

Our unique clothing boutique provided an uplifting in-person shopping experience to 2,817 women and their 4,948 children, all connected through referrals from our partner organizations and programs serving vulnerable women and children throughout the Greater Washington DC area.

Bag-to-Go Program

Our Bag-to-Go program helped 329 women & children with their emergency clothing needs. Packed with love by our volunteer personal shoppers and delivered by the case worker. This program primarily serves domestic violence and human trafficking survivors as they often flee their abusers with nothing but the clothes on their back.





Community Distribution Partners 25.850

Our CDP program has now provided clothing to 7 US States and 23 countries worldwide, expanding our footprint to make a bigger impact. This year we provided our CDPs "redistributors" 25,850 articles of clothing their own locations to support their mission in clothing those in need at no charge.

Children & Youth

Pantry celebrated it's one year anniversary in June 2021!

3.702 Community Diaper Pantry

Our Diaper Pantry provides a monthly supply of diapers, wipes, and period supplies to on average 400 low-income families a month. Started in June 2020 to meet the needs of those struggling to make ends meet during the pandemic. The cost of diapers puts an enormous financial strain on struggling families and often families are forced to choose between diapers and necessities.

Back-to-School Supply Program

Our Back-to-School Supply program provided 372 students backpacks, clothing, and shoes that they are proud to wear. By fueling their confidence, it encourages them to stay in school by helping them focus on their strengths and not their struggles.





Holiday Gifts for Kids

Our annual Santa's Workshop provided 4,448 toys and gifts to 592 local low-income children. All handpicked and wrapped by their mothers, allowing them to contribute to their children's happiness, free from financial limitations.

8,249 Kids Snack Packs

8,249 Kids Snack Packs are assembled by volunteers and supply kids we serve with two days worth of easily to prepare meals.
